



2022 Virtual First Flight Field Trip *Frequently Asked Questions*

Will the 2022 First Flight Field Trip be held at Honda Center?

No, due to continued COVID-19 restrictions, the 2022 First Flight Field Trip has been converted to a virtual event.

How will the 2022 First Flight Field Trip be presented?

The 2022 First Flight Field Trip will be presented as a live video stream featuring interactive elements. Classrooms will have the option to view the broadcast through any device that has access to a web browser. Please access the virtual event on March 2 by clicking anaheimducks.com/firstflight22. When will the live video stream take place?
